Proposal Guidelines

We are always looking for quality instructors! If you are interested in offering a lecture or workshop that offers continuing education credits through the Center for Professional Development, please reach out to the Director of the Center at cpd@scu.edu. Be sure to include the following information in your proposal:

- 1. Your curriculum vitae
- 2. The name of the lecture/workshop you'd like to offer, as well as the length and general or time of year you'd like to offer it
- 3. A course description: A brief statement/narrative about your course content. Please include
 - how your course focuses on psychological assessment and intervention methods that have credible empirical support, OR
 - how it focuses on ethical, legal, statutory or regulatory policies, guidelines, and standards that impact psychological practice, education or research, OR
 - how it focuses on psychological practice, education, or research that is supported by contemporary scholarship grounded in established research procedures.
- 4. A list of the learning objectives that will be accomplished by the end of the lecture/workshop
- 5. At least 3 peer-reviewed, scholarly articles within the last 10 years that are relevant to your workshop
- 6. The target audience, including whether the content will be for the introductory, intermediate, or advanced learner
- 7. A statement that explains how your workshop addresses multiculturalism and the needs of underrepresented populations
- 8. A statement that describes the value, accuracy, and utility of the course content, as well as the limitation of the content being taught, and the severe and most common risks.
