

Guidelines for Published Scholarship in a Language other than English

Any candidate for promotion whose scholarship includes published articles or books in a language other than English must include an abstract summarizing the contents of each such publication for the review process. If the publication is a book, the candidate may decide to provide an abstract of each chapter of the book. Alternatively, the candidate may decide that an abstract summarizing the purpose of the work and its principal conclusions would be sufficient. Abstracts may not be necessary for creative works composed in a language other than English such as a poem. Any uncertain case should be referred to the Dean of the appropriate school or college for a decision.
